June 11, 2021 Severin **von Eckardstein**

Shigeru Kawai SK 7 (2019) Works by W. A. Mozart, F. Chopin, C. Debussy, S. Rachmaninoff, C. Saint-Saëns


Severin von Eckardstein is one of the most important German pianists of his generation and is at home on many of the world's great stages with solo and orchestral concerts. The winner of the "Grand Prix International Reine Elisabeth in Brussels" (2003) gives highly acclaimed concerts all over the world. In 2020 at the time of the almost Europe-wide lockdown he made his debut with the Mariinsky Orchestra under Valery Gergiev in St. Petersburg. His CD releases are award-winning.


Hubert Rutkowski's musical interpretations are marked by a passionate attachment to the old school aesthetics of the 19th century. The pianistic traditions of Fryderyk Chopin, Theodor Leschetizky and their successors therefore form the cornerstone of his artistic profile. On March 1, 2021, on Chopin's birthday, he realized the world premiere of Chopin's rediscovered Pleyel grand piano in Hamburg. Since 2018, he is the artistic director of the Chopin Festival Hamburg.



June 12, 2021 Dina **Yoffe**

Online master class with students from Hochschule für Musik und Theater Hamburg Works by F. Chopin

Dina Yoffe is winner of the International Chopin Piano Competition in Warsaw. Highlights of her international career include concerts with outstanding orchestras; among others the Israel Philharmonic under Zubin Mehta, the Japanese Radio Orchestra NHK under Neville Marriner or the Moscow Philharmonic under Valery Gergiev. She has performed in Suntory Hall, NHK Hall (Tokyo), Musikverein (Vienna), Hercules Hall (Munich) and the Salle Pleyel (Paris). Today she is a jury member of many international piano competitions such as in Cleveland (USA), Hamamatsu (Japan) and Warsaw (Poland). She is a visiting professor at the Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing.



June 12, 2021 Mari **Kodama**

Érard (1880) / Shigeru Kawai SK7 (2019) Works by F. Chopin, M. Ravel, H. Dutilleux


Mari Kodama was born in Osaka and grew up in Düsseldorf and Paris. She studied chamber music at the Conservatoire National in Paris with Germaine Mounier and with Geneviève Joy-Dutilleux. Today she enjoys worldwide recognition as an outstanding musician. Not only her Beethoven interpretations, with which she set international standards are highly praised; her versatility, her extraordinary musicality and expressiveness are also praised.



June 13, 2021 Tomasz **Ritter**

Pleyel (1847) Works by F. Schubert, L. van Beethoven, F. Chopin


In 2018, young polish pianist Tomasz Ritter won the first International Chopin Competition on historical pianos in Warsaw at the age of 23. Awarded many prizes, the exceptional musician with a focus on historical keyboard instruments is at the beginning of a great international career and has already played on several continents; enthusiastically acclaimed by critics and audiences.



June 13, 2021 Menno **van Delft**

Harpsichord Zell (1728) Works by J. S. Bach, A. Vivaldi, F. Couperin, J. A. Reincken

Menno van Delft is not only a harpsichordist, but also an organist and musicologist, as well as a professor of harpsichord at the Amsterdam Conservatory and at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater Hamburg. He gives concerts and master classes throughout Europe as well as the USA and has been making recordings for radio and television for many years. He has been a guest at several Bach festivals of the Neue Bachgesellschaft and and his recordings include but are not limited to numerous works by J.S. Bach.




June 13, 2021 Stepan **Simonian**

Shigeru Kawai SK 6 (2019) Works by J. S. Bach, A. Vivaldi, F. Couperin, J. A. Reincken

Hailed by the professional press as "one of the great Bach interpreters of his generation" Stepan Simonian is driven by a desire to make the great piano works of famous composers and of course Bach shine in their complexity. Winning the silver medal at the 2010 Bach Competition in Leipzig, extensive training at the Moscow Conservatory and with Evgeni Koroliov in Hamburg are among those experiences that shape his interpretations.


